New State Testing for Math- What does that mean for my student?

Beginning in the spring of 2011, students in grades 7-12 will begin taking "End-of-Course" math exams. The state is moving to end-of-course exams so students can be tested on the knowledge and skills they've gained from a specific course rather than on a comprehensive test like the High School Proficiency (HSPE) that assess overall knowledge.

We will be testing students on June 7th, 8th and 9th using our two hour late start schedule which we did for the recent HSPE. All students enrolled in Algebra I or above will be required to take one or two tests depending upon both their grade level and currently enrolled math course. Math teachers will be sharing the specifics with their students in the next few weeks.

The Legislature is currently discussing the "end-of-course" assessments and may make changes during this session. Please stay tuned for further information once we become aware of any changes.

With Spring Weather Approaching, it's Time To Review the C.H.S. Dress Code

The administration and staff at Capital High School are committed to providing a quality learning environment for all students and teachers. To help maintain this goal, the following dress expectations will be maintained:

- Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than **4 inches above the middle of the knee**.
- Shirts must cover the stomach, back, shoulders, and chest. Tube tops, halter-tops, spaghetti strap tank tops and only one shoulder strap are not appropriate for school.
- Cleavage must not be visible.
- "See-through" material is not appropriate for school.
- Undergarments or clothing worn as undergarments must not be showing. This includes pants worn so low that garments worn under the pants are showing.
- Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times.

Students may not wear clothing or accessories that:

- Advocates or conveys alcohol or drug usage messages
- Promotes violence or illegal activity
- Demeans or degrades individuals or groups of people
- Exhibits sexual innuendos, blatant sexual messages, vulgarity, profanity or other inappropriate language
- Interferes with the operation of the school or classroom
- Is determined by local law enforcement to be affiliated with gangs

If a student's clothing is objectionable under these provisions, a staff member will request the student make appropriate corrections. If a student refuses to comply, the appropriate discipline action for non-compliance or willful disobedience will result. This policy is in effect for all school related events on or off campus. .

In Individual Events, the Cougars took 2nd in the 2A/3A division, thanks to strong performances by Sampath Duddu (5th place, Oratory), Jackson Burgess (3rd, Impromptu), Grace Lynch (2nd, Impromptu). We also had a state champion: Josie Coury took 1st place in Oratory. Senior Vamsi Chunduru was nominated for the Erik Helppie award, the most prestigious individual merit for Speech and Debate that the WSFA provides. He was recognized for his competitive accomplishments--and, more important, for his service to the team and to the community--with a 3rd place finish.
